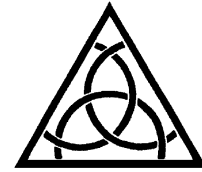

### Job Purpose

At Trinity our Teaching Staff are more than just subject teachers. They work alongside fellow teachers and staff, to help to create a caring, calm, purposeful learning environment for our precious pupils. They should have experience of working across Key Stages 3 & 4. They will be able to plan, differentiate and deliver lessons. They will have experience of working as part of a team and will be able to contribute to the life of the school.

### General Responsibilities

- To act in accordance with the school’s mission & vision of:  
“Bringing the Love of God into the Classroom.”  
“Enabling each pupil to achieve their God-given potential.”  
This is an occupational requirement.
- To plan and deliver PSHE lessons and sequences of lessons to the highest standard, thereby ensuring meaningful learning takes place and pupils make rapid and sustained progress.
- To develop one’s own teaching practice to a level of advanced proficiency.
- To provide an excellent Christian role model that is in line with the school’s mission, vision, values and faith statement. This is an occupational requirement.
- To act in accordance with all School Policies and Procedures.
- To, as required, act as a Form Tutor and provide Daily Spiritual/Pastoral Tutoring (in line with the school’s mission, vision, values and faith statement) to pupils during Registration/Bible time.
- To fully implement all Trinity Christian School routines and techniques for creating a culture of high expectations (including break and lunch duties).
- To attend and participate in daily staff prayer times. This is an occupational requirement.
- To contribute to extra-curricular programmes.
- To contribute to the effective daily working of the Trinity Christian School (including break and lunch duties).
- Provide cover for classes using resources provided by teachers.
- To maintain a safe and hygienic classroom environment.

## Teaching and Learning Responsibilities

- To plan and prepare effective teaching schemes and lessons.
- To teach engaging and effective lessons that motivate, inspire and improve pupil attainment.
- To integrate biblical principles and the Christian philosophy of education throughout the curriculum, in accordance with the school's mission, vision, values and faith statement. This is an occupational requirement.
- To use regular assessments to set targets for pupils, monitor pupil progress and respond accordingly to the results of such monitoring.
- To produce/contribute to oral and written assessments, reports and references relating to individual and groups of pupils.
- To develop plans and processes for the classroom with measurable results and evaluate those results to make improvements in pupil achievement.
- To ensure that all pupils achieve their expected progress and potential.
- To promote the inclusion of all pupils, ensuring they have equal opportunities to learn and develop.
- To maintain regular and productive communication with pupils, parents and carers, to report on progress, sanctions and rewards and all other communications.
- To provide or contribute to oral and written assessments, reports and references relating to individual pupils and groups of pupils.
- To direct and supervise support staff/volunteers assigned to lessons and when required participate in related recruitment and selection activities.
- To implement and adhere to all school Policies, ensuring the health and well-being of pupils is maintained at all times.
- To participate in preparing pupils for external examinations.
- To undergo regular observations and participate in staff training, and attend regular INSET training days.
